What is the deal with Christianity?

This question is hardly new. People have been asking it as long as Christianity has existed. Sometimes, they ask the question in wonder: "These people seem so ordinary...so why does it seem like they have something I don't have?" Other times, they ask in exasperation: "Who do these Christians think that they are?" And sometimes they're puzzled: "You really believe a guy rose from the dead and is coming back in the sky?"

People are good at misunderstanding Christianity. Even believers can misunderstand some of the basics of the faith. That's why it is important that we focus on the essential truths. In these seven sessions, we'll be exploring things like:

- God's nature
- Humanity's purpose
- What sin is
- Jesus' death, resurrection, and return
- The work of the Holy Spirit

By the end, sure, I pray that you come out with a richer understanding of Christianity than you had before. But more than that, I pray that you come away with a different view of this figure at its center - a man who was dead, who isn't dead anymore, and whom people haven't been able to stop talking about for two thousand years.



REACHING OUT TO THE LONELY

The story is told about a New York City policeman investigating a case. He made a phone call, but even before he finished dialing, he somehow knew he had made a mistake. He let it ring, though. The phone rang once, twice - then someone picked it up. "You've got the wrong number!" a husky male voice snapped before the line went dead.

Mystified, the policeman dialed again. "I said you got the wrong number!" came the voice. Once more the phone clicked down.

"How could he possibly know I had the wrong number?" the policeman asked himself. A cop is trained to be curious - and concerned. So he dialed a third time. "Hey, c'mon," the voice said. "Is this you again?" "Yeah, it's me. I was wondering how you knew I had the wrong number before I even said anything." "You figure it out!" The phone slammed down.

The policeman sat there for a while, thinking. Then he called the man back. "Did you figure it out yet?" the man asked. "The only thing I can think of is nobody ever calls you." "You got it!" The phone went dead for the fourth time.
